

PIAF Tactile Image Maker
High Quality Tactile Graphics in a Flash

Piaf produces high quality tactile graphics using heat sensitive capsule paper. It is ideal for people who are blind and/or vision impaired. Piaf's controlled heat source causes any black lines, letters or shapes that are drawn, printed or copied onto the capsule paper to swell. The result is an instant tactile graphic. Piaf can be used to introduce simple shapes and basic concepts; to introduce the concept of drawing and two-dimensional rendering of solid objects; to encourage students in taking the first tentative steps to expressing themselves graphically; and to teach the concepts of handwriting and signatures. Later, Piaf can be used to access graphical information in nearly all subject areas, especially Mathematics and Sciences.

Cherokee County Schools provide specially designed instruction for 11 EC students with visual impairments. The students' ages range from Pre-K to High School. The PIAF would enable students with visual impairments assistance with accessing classroom curriculum.

Office of Second Vice District Governor was not filled at the convention. Here is how we fill it now.

Qualifications for Filling a Vacancy for the Office of 1st or 2nd Vice Dist. Governor.

Section 6. FIRST AND SECOND VICE DISTRICT GOVERNORS AND OTHER VACANCIES. Any vacancy in office except that of district governor and first and second vice district governors shall be filled by appointment from the district governor for the unexpired term. In event of a vacancy arising in the office of first or second vice district governor, the district governor shall convene a meeting of the immediate past district governor, first vice district governor and second vice district governor and all past international officers who are members in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in the district. It shall be the duty of the attendees at this meeting to appoint a qualified club member as first or second vice district governor for the remainder of the term. In filling said vacancy, it shall be the duty of the district governor, or if not available, the most recent past district governor who is available, to send out invitations fifteen days (15) in advance of the meeting to attend said meeting and it shall also be their responsibility to preside as chairperson of the meeting. The chairperson shall convey the results to the international office within seven (7) days together with evidence of invitations sent and meeting attendance. Each Lion who is entitled to receive an invitation to attend and is present at said meeting shall be entitled to cast one vote for the Lion of their choice

In order for a Lion to be eligible and qualified to be selected to fill a vacancy in the office of first or second vice district governor, they must:

- 1. Be an Active Member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in their single or subdistrict.
- 2. Secure the endorsement of their club or a majority of the clubs in their single district.
- **3.** Have served or will have served at the time they take office as first or second vice district governor:

As officer of a Lions club for a full term or major portion thereof; and

As a member of the district cabinet for a full term or major portion thereof.

With none of the above being accomplished concurrently.

Has not completed a full term or major portion thereof as district governor.





Vision Screening Newsletter District 31-L

Hello, District 31L Clubs! This is a communication about Vision Screening in District 31-L. So, what's the latest? --- and what does it mean to you?

The emphasis now is to expand NC Lion's KidSight screening program, by increasing the number of clubs that become involved in screening "kids", with the availability of the KidSight Unit (our equipped SUV) being the catalyst that makes it possible. There is a \$75 charge a day for this unit, but WNC Lions will reimburse the \$75. Just send me a copy of the paid invoice from NCLI and I will reimburse the club.

Gordon Gilomen of Canton Lions is handling the operation of vision vehicle and you can reach Gordon at 309 696 4561.

Many clubs have succeeded in gaining access to public elementary schools across NC to screen their kids. Those clubs are to be **congratulated**, because it's quite a challenge to convince public schools that we can enhance what they provide!

So far this year we have vision screened 11135 and referred 1392 at a 13% referral rate.

Screening "kids" doesn't necessarily mean conducting screenings in public schools, So how do we open doors to organizations/venues that provide services to the younger kids? I'm glad you asked! We do it by contacting day care center directors, Head Start directors, Pre-K directors, Early Head Start directors, non-profits that support such organizations. We provide program literature and attempt to meet with them to offer our FREE services, to supplement what they already provide.

Quite a few clubs already have their own photorefrac-

tive screening devices, PlusOptix or SPOT, and the necessary certified screeners or volunteers (from their club and nearby clubs) to move forward with screenings without further assistance.

Other clubs that don't have the screening devices and/or the screeners or other volunteers need only to contact me to discuss how to move forward. We will assess your circumstances and work together to develop a plan. We provide onsite training for Lions clubs.

To all Zone Chairs and Future Zone chairs, the opportunity to have Bryan Hoover come and do training in our district. Also, Gordon and I are available to do training. Please contact Governor Susan Fernandez or me to arrange.

Don't forget to use the NCLF VSP voucher program to receive eye exams and glasses at no charge to Club and NCLF.

At first we thought it was just a calamity of errors that fell into place but when we stood back and looked at the whole situation we realized that that wasn't the case, someone had his hand on our shoulder and guided us in every step we took.

The event was a childrens screening at Mt Sinai Community Baptist Church. The reason it came about was an accidental phone butt dial to Pastor Gray which led into a conversation about conducting a children's screening at his church. Dates and times were discussed with follow up discussion planned prior to the event date. Well a call came from Pastor Gray's assistant on Wednesday stating they were ready and what time we would be there on Sunday. Well due to the late notice I asked if we could reschedule as we didn't have volunteers in place. Well Pastor Gray is very persuasive and let me know he already had over twenty kids lined up along several other churches from the community also sending kids. So I sent out an email to our club asking for volunteers and seven responded that they would be there. On Sunday we ended up screening fifty two kids and referred several for follow up examinations. One screening in particular stood out and the mother was gracious in sharing her story below. So once you have read her story you can see that sometimes what we might consider a calamity of errors is actually God's hand on our shoulder helping us in serving others. I am appealing to you as a Lion to reach out and serve your community with screening children by joining the NCLF KidSight program. Miracles are real, let yourself be there when it happens.

I was so fortunate to get Ian in that same day with Graystone eye and they confirmed the Lions club findings. As it turns out lan is farsighted.

If it wasn't for Mt. Sinai Baptist Church and the Lions Club it may have been months or even years before I knew about the eye problems lan has. He has taken eye exams with the eye chart before, but he has never had an exam with the eye machine. Untreated, his eye sight could have gotten progressively worse. He may have even started to develop problems in school with his learning and school work because of problems with his vision. I am so thankful for the Lions club and their eye exam program because without them, my son's future could have been greatly affected. I could never say thank you enough. After Ian's visit with Graystone Eye, I reached out to Pastor Gray and also Connie to let them know how much I appreciate them and everything that was done for Ian. Have a blessed day.
